Dear Parent/Guardian,

Your child is currently enrolled in the Outdoor Education (OE) program at ENSS that consists of a double credit package in either grade 11 (SVN 3M/PAD 3O) or grade 12 (CGF3M/PAD 4O). Part of both programs is to participate in two overnight camping expeditions. The dates for these two overnight trips are noted below.

The first overnight trip is three days at Kawartha Highlands
Provincial Park, which will serve as a learning ground for basic
camping, canoeing, and leave-no-trace skills. As well as a chance
to achieve their Basic Canoeing Level 1 or 2 certification through
the Ontario Recreational Canoeing and Kayaking Association
(ORCKA). The second trip is a five-day canoe trip in Algonquin
Provincial Park. More information, including itinerary and maps, will
be forthcoming as the planning progresses for this early May trip.

To cover the expenses for this trip, other day trips, as well as industry certification(s), there is a user fee of \$325. A portion of this user fee (at least \$150) is due <u>as soon as possible</u> prior to any course excursions.

We will be holding an OE parent information meeting on Wednesday, March 27<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 pm in room 236 (this is also the same date as our school's regularly scheduled parents' night). At this meeting we will further outline the OE program, our safety procedures, and give you a chance to meet us and ask questions prior to our canoe trip.

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## **Elements of Risk:**

The Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board attempts to manage, as effectively as possible, the risk involved for students while participating in this activity. ## **Concussion Awareness, Recognition and Management**

Students are to be made aware of signs and symptoms of a concussion. Should a student experience an incident that may have resulted in a concussion they will be removed from the activity and parental notification will be provided. If a concussion has been diagnosed, the Request to Resume Participation - Concussion Return to Learn & Physical Activities form must be completed by a Physician before a student returns to class, intramural, inter-school and/or additional risk activities. - I will be conscious of, and report, any hazards that may impact the safety of myself or my peers.
- I will make my teacher aware of any deficiencies in equipment being used or potential hazards in an activity's operating area.

## Teaching/learning the rules of a physical activity, including the strict enforcement of consequences for prohibited play that is considered high-risk for causing concussions

- I will learn and follow the training and instruction provided to conduct the activity safely. I will follow the teacher's instructions prohibiting behaviours that are considered high-risk for causing concussions.
- I will respect and accept that the teacher will strictly enforce, during activity, practice and competition, the consequences for dangerous behaviour.

## Implementing the skills and strategies of an activity in a proper progression

- I will follow my teacher's instructions about the proper progression of skills and strategies of the activity.
- I will ask questions and seek clarity for any skills and strategies of which I am unsure.

## Providing opportunities to discuss potential issues related to concussions

• I will talk to my teacher or caring adult if I have questions or issues about a suspected or diagnosed concussion or about my safety in general.

## **Concussion recognition and reporting**

- I have read and am familiar with an approved Concussion Awareness Resources provided by my teacher in the link at the end of this document.
- I will remove myself immediately from any activity and will tell the teacher or caring adult if I think I might have a concussion.
- I will tell the teacher or caring adult immediately when I think a teammate/classmate might have a concussion.
- I understand that if I receive a jarring impact to the head, face, neck, or elsewhere on my body that is observed by or reported to the coach/teacher, that I will be removed immediately from the sport/activity, and:
- I am aware that when I have signs or symptoms I should go to a medical doctor or nurse practitioner to be diagnosed as soon as reasonably possible that day, and will report the results to appropriate school staff.
- I am aware that not all signs and symptoms emerge immediately and there are times when signs and symptoms emerge hours or days after the incident and I must stop physical activities and be monitored for the next 24 hours.
- If no signs or symptoms appear after 24 hours, I will inform the appropriate school staff and I can then be allowed to participate.
- If signs or symptoms begin, I will be assessed by a medical doctor or nurse practitioner as soon as reasonably
  possible that day and will report the results to appropriate school staff.

## Acknowledging the importance of communication between the student, parent, school staff, and any sport organization with which the student has registered

• I will communicate with my coaches/teacher, parent/guardian, and school staff and any sport organization with which I am registered about a suspected or diagnosed concussion or general safety issues.

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## Supporting the implementation of a Return to School Plan for students with a concussion diagnosis

- I understand that I will have to follow the return to School Plan if diagnosed with a concussion.
- I understand I will not be able to return to full participation in school activities including sports practices or competitions until permitted to do so in accordance with the School Board's Return to School Plan.
- I understand that I will need a Medical Clearance as required by the Return to School Plan, prior to returning to full participation in "non-contact sports" or returning to a practice that includes full contact in "contact sports".

for Semester II (February to June), 2024 - Updated November 29th, 2023

## Day Trips/Activities:

- Proctor Park This municipal park is located within walking distance of the school. We will visit this park on a weekly/bi-weekly basis to study its ecosystem and for various other forms of programming.
- Outdoor Adventure Show February 23<sup>rd</sup> (Friday) This will be a full day trip to Toronto to
  explore Canada's largest exhibition of outdoor related gear, outfitters, and continuing education
  opportunities. Students will be responsible for making their OWN way home.
- Indoor Rock Climbing March 6<sup>th</sup> (Wednesday) We will be visiting the new location of the Boiler Room Climbing Gym in Kingston. All fees and equipment rental are included in the cost of the OE program.
- OE Parents' Night Meeting March 27<sup>th</sup> (Wednesday) We will be holding an OE parent information meeting at 5:00 pm in room 236. This evening also doubles as our school's regularly scheduled parents' night. At this meeting we will further outline the OE program, our safety procedures, and give you a chance to meet us and ask questions prior to our canoe trips.
- Goodrich Loomis Conservation Area March 28<sup>th</sup> (Thursday) These will be half-day (afternoon) trip to work on our GPS, geocaching skills, and tree identification skills.
- <u>Swimming Test Afternoon</u> April 3<sup>rd</sup> (Wednesday) All participants in the course <u>must</u> complete a pool swim test to attend the scheduled canoe trip(s). Students will have to swim 100 metres (fully clothed) and tread water for 5 minutes while wearing a properly fitted PFD. Basic canoe rescues and strokes will also be covered in this pool session. Students will be responsible for making their <u>OWN</u> way home.
- Canoe Skills Afternoon April 22<sup>nd</sup> (Monday) Students will practice their canoeing skills at the Brighton public boat launch in preparation for our upcoming canoe trip(s). This is also a <u>mandatory session</u>. (Rain date: Thursday March 25<sup>th</sup>)
- Mountain Biking Early June -- This will be our second year offering mountain biking opportunities to our OE students. Mountain biking dates and locations will include:
  - June (3<sup>rd</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup>) Safe biking instruction (both in-class & outside)
  - June (10<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup>) Afternoon bike ride to Presqu'ile Provincial Park

## **OE Course Conduct and Agreement**

By signing this agreement, students commit to adhering to the following rules of conduct and expectations, both within the classroom and on field trips:

1. Attendance:

<u>In class</u> – unjustified classroom absences <u>(especially the day before a field trip)</u> may result in the removal of the student from field trip(s) for being unprepared due to important trip logistics being covered in class.

<u>On Trip(s)</u> – this is a participatory credit and active participation is expected. If you're absent from a field trip, a mark of zero will be awarded and an alternative assignment will be provided. Once the alternative assignment is submitted, its grade will replace the zero for the missed field trip.

- 2. Homework and Missed School Work Students are responsible for catching up on all schoolwork and assessments missed during field trips. Students are required to speak to their teacher(s) **prior** to any the field trip to ensure that teacher(s) are aware of their absence; to ensure that students know specifically what assignments will be due upon return; and, to set up a reasonable time frame for late submission to be accepted by their teacher(s).
- 3. Students <u>must</u> be passing all courses, as a prerequisite, to participate/attend the extended canoe trip(s). Since further student absences from class would negatively impact their mark(s), an alternative assignment will be provided.
- 4. All our field trips involve an element of risk and requires risk assessment to keep everyone safe, this includes all participants. If a students' attitude, conduct and/or behaviour would put them **or** others at risk on a field trip, this student will not be allowed to attend/participate. An alternative assignment will be provided in this case.
- 5. No alcohol, drugs, smoking and/or vaping
- 6. Misuse of equipment will result in the student/parent being financially responsible for repair and/or replacement of said equipment.

Any student breaking these rules will be removed from the field trip immediately. Parents/guardians will be required to pick up their child from the trip. Moreover, the student jeopardizes their success in the course and may be removed from the Outdoor Education program entirely.

## **Student Expectations**

- Always treat one another with respect.
- Promote respect and assist their teachers, supervisors, and peer helpers.
- Always be on time for field trips/activities. Tardiness causes the entire group to be delayed.
- Always use appropriate vocabulary.

The Parties understand that the Organization may fail to safeguard or protect the Participant from the risks, dangers and hazards of the Activities, some of which are listed below. The risks, dangers and hazards include, but are not limited to:
  - The inherent risks of the Activities, including:
    - Improper or incomplete provision or maintenance of paddling equipment, such as canoes, kayaks, stand up paddle boards, paddles, PFDs, and paddling i. rescue safety equipment.
    - ii. Improper or incomplete provision or maintenance of tripping equipment, such as tents, tarps, kitchen equipment, and packs,
    - Improper or incomplete provision or maintenance of transportation equipment, such as vehicles, paddling equipment, and tripping equipment, iii.
    - Improper or incomplete provision or maintenance of first-aid resources or equipment, such as first-aid kits and material, iv.
    - Improper or incomplete provision of participant registration information, such as waivers, medical forms, emergency contact forms, and determination V. of swimming ability, paddling ability/experience, and general level of fitness,
    - Improper or incomplete provision of food and water-related information, such as nutrition, hydration, water purification, wildlife management, and vi.
    - Inability to properly secure or prepare the 'instructional environment' location or 'wilderness tripping route', which may include a waterfront dock, vii. public beach site, campsite or portage route, private property, a conservation area, a Provincial or National Park, or crown land,
    - Risks associated with transporting participants or equipment, viii.
    - Risks associated with paddling in rough water conditions, encountering water hazards, swimming/floating, using paddles, using rope and other ix. paddling equipment, carrying a canoe and other paddling equipment, and with accidents or illness in a remote place without medical facilities,
    - Improper or incomplete accounting for safe wilderness travel, weather, or paddling,
    - Inability to provide a safe wilderness camping environment, such as by failing to be aware of site hazards, lack of awareness of hazards (related to the xi. kitchen, stove, firepit, and camp hygiene), failing to follow swimming protocol, and prolonging exposure to the elements,
    - Inability to provide for emergency response, such as by creating an evacuation plan, rescuing the Participant or equipment, determining an alternate xii. route, sourcing alternate leadership, or providing first-aid.
  - Health: executing strenuous and demanding physical techniques; physical exertion; overexertion; repetitive actions; stretching; dehydration; fatigue; cardiovascular workouts; rapid movements and stops; lack of fitness or conditioning; traumatic injury; hyperthermia; hypothermia; sprains and fractures, spinal cord injuries, bacterial infections; drowning; rashes; contact with plants, animals, reptiles or insects; and the transmission of communicable diseases, including viruses of all kinds, COVID-19, bacteria, parasites or other organisms or any mutation thereof,

- c) Premises: defective, dangerous or unsafe condition of the facilities; falls; collisions with objects, walls, equipment or persons; dangerous, unsafe, or irregular conditions on the ground or other surfaces; extreme weather conditions; and travel to and from the premises,
- d) Use of equipment: mechanical failure of the equipment; negligent design or manufacture of the equipment; the provision of or the failure by the Organization to provide any warnings, directions, instructions or guidance as to the use of the equipment; failure to wear safety or protective equipment; and failure to use or operate equipment within the Participant's own ability,
- e) Contact: contact with equipment associated with the Activities, other equipment, vehicles, or other persons; and other contact that may lead to serious bodily injury, including but not limited to concussions and/or other brain injury or serious spinal injury,
- f) Advice: negligent advice regarding the Activities,
- 3) Ability: failing to act safely or within the Participant's own ability or within designated areas,
- h) Cyber: privacy breaches; hacking; and technology malfunction or damage,
- i) Conduct: the Participant's conduct and conduct of other persons including any physical altercation between participants,
- Travel: travel to and from the Activities.
